
Motor Routes to the Bar 10 Lodge



The Bar 10 Lodge is located approximately 70 miles south of S. George, Utah and 89 miles southwest of Cane Beds/Colorado City, Arizona

(RECOMMENDED ROUTE)

St. George to Bar 10: Exit 4 (Bloomington Exit). Turn onto Brigham Road going east. Follow Brigham road until you come to River Road (approximately 3 miles). Turn Right (South) at River Road. Follow River Road out of town to the UT-AZ state line (where the pavement gives way to a graded gravel surface.) Stay on this main road following all signs to Mt. Trumbull, until you get to a 4-way junction at the Mt. Trumbull School House (approximately 56 miles South of St. George). At the Junction, continue straight, towards Whitmore Canyon. <u>DO NOT</u> turn left and continue on to Mt. Trumbull. The BAR 10 RANCH is located approximately 14 miles south of the Mt. Trumbull School House and will take about 30 minutes to travel. Travel with Caution. Note: This road is impassible during inclement weather. The last 14 miles require a high-clearance vehicle.

Cane Beds/Colorado City to Bar 10: From State Route 389, a few miles south of Colorado City, go west on the dirt road at the Cane Beds Exit located just south of the North Canyon Court House. This road is County Rd 5 (Clayhole Road). Travel approx. 7 miles on that dirt road to the Navajo Trail turnoff (County Rd 30). There is a sign for that turnoff, which is approx 1 mile south of the power lines. Head west on the Navajo Trail all the way to County Rd 5 and then turn left and head south on that road. Stay on this main road following all signs to Mt. Trumbull, until you get to a 4-way junction at the Mt. Trumbull School House. At the Junction, continue straight, towards Whitmore Canyon. <u>DO NOT</u> turn left and continue on to Mt. Trumbull. The BAR 10 RANCH is located approximately 14 miles south of the Mt. Trumbull School House and will take about 30 minutes to travel. Travel with Caution. Note: This road is impassible during inclement weather. The last 14 miles require a high-clearance vehicle.
